The Florida Division of Blind Services' (DBS) mission is to ensure blind and visually impaired Floridians have the tools, support and opportunity to achieve success. Since 1941, the agency has made a huge difference in attacking the attitudinal barriers and the lack of technology access that have hindered people who are blind from fully participating in society and the workforce.

Through DBS, blind and visually impaired Floridians have access to many educational, vocational, medical, social and recreational services beginning at birth and continuing through their senior years.

The Division, in conjunction with its Community Rehabilitation Programs, serves almost 12,000 individuals in its client service programs each year; and more than 32,000 individuals receive services through The DBS Braille and Talking Books Library.
